The Rev. Stacie R. Fidlar of Rock Island, Ill., was elected June 18 to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Northern Illinois Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during the synod assembly, which met online on June 5 and 12 and then in person

at Augustana College in Rock Island June 17-18.

Fidlar was elected on the fifth ballot with 219 votes to 111 votes for the Rev. Dr. Janet Hunt, pastor of First Lutheran Church in DeKalb, Ill. A total of 166 votes was needed for election.

The bishop-elect has served as pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church in Rock Island since 1999. She was pastor of Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Seneca, Ill., from 1995 to 1999 and interim pastor of St. James Lutheran Church in Forreston, Ill., in 1995.

Fidlar earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in religion with an Asian studies concentration from Augustana College in 1991 and her Master of Divinity degree from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago in 1995. She completed the Shalem Institute Group Leaders Program in 2002 and participates in ongoing continuing education with foci on leadership, spirituality and foundation management. The Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago is one of seven ELCA seminaries.

Fidlar will take office on Sept. 1. Her installation is scheduled for Oct. 8 at Trinity Lutheran Church in Rockford, Ill. Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton will officiate at the installation.

The Rev. Jeffrey Clements, who has served as bishop of the Northern Illinois Synod since 2016, is retiring.




## ST. JAMES COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS, June 2022

# ST. JAMES COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS, JUNE 2022

The in-person and virtual June 2022 Council meeting was called to order at 7:03 p.m. on Wednesday, June 15th, by President Bethany Weipert. Nine of ten members were present. Pastor Knowles opened with a prayer. The minutes of the May meeting were approved. Treasurer's report through May reflected Treasurer Doug a good year so far. Nelson informed us that he sent checks to all recipient organizations of our \$25,000 tithe of Bobby Davis's estate They were all grateful, proceeds. especially Boy Scout Troop 258, who sent the church a thank-vou note signed by the scouts and leaders. The \$2,800 check for the support of the Mdori Parish in Tanzania is slowly but surely making its way there. Bethany recapped the results of the June 5th Special Congregational Meeting, at which we voted unanimously to approve White Roofing's bid to replace the shingles on our building's roof. In an ad hoc meeting after that, the Property Team unanimously agreed on the shingle Weathered Wood. Doug reminded us that no down payment was necessary, 90% would be paid upon completion, and the remaining 10% would be paid when the warranty

agreement was in place. The Team is also getting bids to replace some of the outside doors. And finally, the Team signed a bid to have White Roofing replace the four skylights, which are cracked and leaking water. The official date of the annual Corn Roast is Sunday, August 21st. The corn will be roasted, not boiled, as was once considered. The main dish will be pulled pork. All Saints and Calvary Lutheran Church will be invited. More information will be given as the date approaches. Communication issues with LSTC about the endowment scholarship agreement are delaying its implementation. Compliments were given on how beautiful our garden looks, thanks to the talent and hard work of Donna Renneke and others. Beinke asked for volunteers to serve and clean up during Social Hour following worship services on June 26th and July 3<sup>rd</sup>. Though she will be out of town on both days, she will provide the food and set up the serving table. If you could lend a hand, please sign the sheet outside the kitchen. The meeting was adjourned at 7:26 p.m. The next meeting will be held on Wednesday, July 20, 2022, at 7:00 p.m.

### Letter of Gift

We are pleased to formalize our commitment to endow a scholarship fund at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago in support of the seminary's mission to train visionary leaders who bear witness to the good news of Jesus Christ.

#### Ршрове:

The Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago will use our gift to create the St. James Lutheran Rock Island Endowed Scholarship Fund. As of December 31, 2021, we have given a total of \$28,000 to this fund. We reserve the right to confinue giving in the future and thus increase the overall balance of the fund.

The St. James Lutheran Rock Island Endowed Scholarship Fund will constitute an integral part of the seminary's endowment. The principal of the fund may be invested in common with other funds of like character, provided that the separate identity of the Fund is preserved at all times. Expendable income from the Fund, as determined by applicable LSTC policy, will be used to cover scholarships, with a preference for a student intending to become a Word and Sacrament ordained pastor, who fit one of the following criteria, in this order:

- 1. A member of St. James Lutheran Church, Rock Island
- A member of a congregation in the West Conference of the Northern Illinois Synod of the ELCA.
- 3. A member of a congregation in the Northern Illinois Synod of the ELCA
- 4. A member of a parish in the North Central Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania
- 5. A member of another congregation outside of these areas

If, in the opinion of the LSTC Board of Directors, it eventually becomes impossible, impracticable, or inadvisable to use the expendable income from the Fund for the foregoing purpose, the LSTC Board of Directors may apply the income to such other purposes as will most nearly accomplish the intention and at the same time permit appropriate and continuing recognition of the nature of this gift.

The St. James Lutheran Rock Island Endowed Scholarship is now available for a student studying to become a pastor according to the priorities listed in the agreement above. The endowed fund is now at \$30,000.
