Oh, God! Why have you given me the resources I need to have a place to live, clothes to wear and food to eat?

Oh, God! Why have you given me caring friends?

Oh, God! Why have you given me your love, mercy, and forgiveness?

Oh, God! Why have you given me the gift of life now and through death to eternity in your kingdom?

These are just a few of the blessings *I* have been given to which I might utter, "Oh, God. Why me?"

In this month in which we celebrate Thanksgiving, I invite you to generate your own list of blessings in response to the plea, "Oh, God! Why me?" Let this be a season in which we open our eyes and our hearts to recognize all the good that is around us and comes to us.

THE OUTSIDE IS DONE; TIME TO STOCK UP

The community is impressed and eager as the CMC building is nearing completion.

next steps:

Now that the outside of the building is done, it is time to stock the inside with furniture, medicine, machinery, and supplies before we begin patient care January 2026.

We are so thankful for our loyal donors as they continue their faith in us and our dedication to the medically underserved in Tanzania.

We have had a wonderful and productive trip to Chihoni. First, let me say that the pictures of the outpatient building do not do justice to the scope, and dare I say, grandeur of the place. We have had local and regional officials visit with jaw-dropping, wide-eyed reactions that were quite telling. The progress on the building has been phenomenal. The work of our project manager Selemani Shabani, with the help of David West, has shown wonderful fruit.

We have looked into an electronic medical record system for the facility, but we are waiting on a response from the company about a customized program that fits our specific needs. We currently have the core of a working telephone

system that has been tested and appears to be entirely ready for prime time. This may seem like a distraction, but the Tanzanian government all but requires these items. There are monthly reports required by the Ministry of Health. Manual extraction of these reports is time consuming, inefficient, and a waste of resources when the press of a button can extract the necessary data.

In addition to the outpatient building, the basic structure and the 1st floor ceiling/2nd floor base of the guest hostel is now in place. We have been bouncing around some ideas for enhancements of guest services, but the opening of the outpatient department is foremost on the agenda. At the time of the Grand Opening, the first floor of the guest hostel must be available because we have our first medical students coming, as well as volunteers to celebrate the opening event.

I am thankful for the wonderful and passionate staff we have, who have accomplished so much in such a short time.
