### From the Pastor:

I'm a fan of the TV series, *The Big Bang Theory*. It is one of those shows that I can watch over and over again. Among my favorite episodes is a Christmas episode, "The Bath Item Gift Hypothesis."

In this episode Sheldon shares his distaste for gift giving. His personality requires him to make sure that all things are equal. So, if he receives a gift, he feels obligated to give a return gift of exactly the same value. When Sheldon learns that the neighbor across the hall, Penny, intends to give him a gift, he is distraught. How can he possibly pick out a reciprocal gift of equal value until he knows the value of the gift he is to receive? His solution: go to *Bed*, *Bath and Beyond* to purchase multiple baskets of bath products, each with a different value. When he receives Penny's gift, he will simply give her the basket closest in value and return the rest. Everything will be in balance.

The problem is that Penny, a waitress at the *Cheesecake Factory*, gives him a napkin that was signed for Sheldon by Leonard Nimoy (who played the role of Spock in the old sci-fi TV series, Star Trek). Being the ultimate Star Trek fan, the gift is beyond value for Sheldon. In response he gives Penny <u>all</u> the gift baskets. When Penny responds in confusion, Sheldon replies, "I know. It's not enough."

Perhaps there is a lesson for us in the interaction between Penny and Sheldon in "The Bath Item Gift Hypothesis." Sheldon immediately recognized that the gift from Penny was extravagant beyond compare and gave her everything he had. Even with that, he knew it was not enough.

We, too, have all received a gift of incomparable value. God has given us forgiveness, new life and salvation through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. There is no amount of bath product gift baskets that we can give back to God to put things in balance. And God knows that. But as we receive that gift in joy, our response to God ought to be like Sheldon's response to Penny – to give to God all that we can and recognize that it is not enough.

And so I invite to remember the gift beyond value that God has given you. Know that Jesus died for you. Then consider how you can respond to this great gift. How do we possibly show God how much we appreciate his incomparable gift? We show our love for God through our acts of love for one another. We love God by offering our gifts of time, our gifts of talent, and our gifts of our resources for the work of God in the world.

Though our offerings will never bring things into balance with God, they are a sure sign of how much we appreciate the great gift that God has given us.

### ST. JAMES COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS, June 2022

The in-person and virtual July 2022 Council meeting was called to order at 7:03 p.m. on Wednesday, July 20th, by Vice President Leslie Cox. Nine of ten members were present. Pastor Knowles opened with a prayer. The minutes of the June meeting were approved. The Treasurer's report through June reflected a good year so far. Some of the building and officerelated expenses have been a challenge, but we will likely end the year just fine.

Pastor Knowles announced that he will be on vacation September 6th-19th, including two Sundays, the 11th and 18th . He will be camping in beautiful Door County, WI.

We approved a request from the pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church in Peru, Illinois, to financially help a single mother who wishes to move back to the Quad Cities. She lived in Milan when she was 19.

Both St. James and LSTC have signed the needed documents and acknowledged the other's signatures for the endowed scholarship fund. Although LSTC, not St. James, will be in charge of selecting scholarship recipients from this fund, members should watch for details in the newsletter about how they can help.

The \$2,800 check for the support of the Mdori Parish in Tanzania finally arrived there. We will be notified of what it will be used for.

The Property Team has received bids for replacing the outside doors. Funds for this will come from the Davises' trusts, as will those for windows, skylights, shingled roofing, and other exterior repairs. It was noted that Bobby Davis was a roofer!

After a thorough presentation by Finance Team member Doug Nelson, we adopted the Finance/ Stewardship Team's proposal for the "Distribution of Undesignated Gifts from Bequests, Estates, Insurance Policies to St. James Lutheran Church." More details on this will be presented at the Annual Congregational Meeting in January 2023, so that this documented policy will be officially approved by the congregation.

Preparations are proceeding for the resurrected Annual Corn Roast, set for Sunday, August 21st. Leslie Cox and Jo Kempf are planning a "coleslaw making day" for the event. All Saints and Calvary Lutheran Church will be invited. More details will be forthcoming.

Pastor Knowles expressed gratitude to all those who planned and participated in his surprise 35th ordination anniversary reception at Calvary on July 16th.

The next meeting will be on Wednesday, September 21st. Since we will not have an August meeting, the Executive Committee will take care of any urgent issues that arise in the meantime. The meeting was adjourned at 8:17 p.m.
