2025 Pastor's Report

Somewhere I heard the saying, “The only constant in life is change.” I suppose some aspects of that cliché are debatable. But change is undoubtedly inevitable.

On a personal level in 2025 I certainly experienced change through the death of my oldest brother, Bill. He was a significant influence in my life. While we were not in regular contact, I miss knowing that he is around. I served as Bill’s healthcare power-of-attorney, and in the final month of his life I spent a significant amount of time helping coordinate his care, including several trips to Champaign County where he lived. Now I am navigating the process of closing his estate as his executor, which will include more trips to Champaign for things like selling his house and car. I am deeply grateful for all your notes of support and sympathy during this time and for your patience as I need to be out of town to deal with Bill’s estate. I will do my best to make sure this business has minimal impact on my ministry among you.

As a congregation we also have experienced changes in 2025. Most notably is the change that is occurring through our participation in the RIM (Rock Island/Moline) churches and RIM task force. In Rock Island and Moline there are eight ELCA congregations. All eight, to some degree, are experiencing the changes that exist in Christian churches in general: aging membership, declining participation, shrinking financial support, and increasing, often expensive, building maintenance.

In response to those challenges, and after more than a year of conversation among the pastors, we have begun to understand the need for collaboration and cooperation among us. To that end, the eight congregations joined together for worship twice in 2025, a Pentecost celebration in Centennial Hall at Augustana, and joining in the celebration of First, Moline’s 175th anniversary in December. Both services were a true expression of worship and joy as the one body of Christ we represent in Rock Island and Moline.

The RIM task force was established as a group of lay leaders from all eight congregations to continue to explore ways that we can best serve God’s mission in our communities in the years to come. I can’t predict what the pathway to the future will be for our congregations, but I have no doubt that it will involve change.

At the same time, Calvary and St. James continue to explore what our future might look like and how it might need to change. Thanks to the members of the Vision Team (Valorie Daniel, Pam Gross, Jerry Johansen, Greg Johnson, Terrill Johnson, Terry Langston,

Donna Renneke, and Bethany Weipert) the process continues to move forward as we seek to work together and support each other for the sake of the gospel.

Together in 2025 St. James and Calvary worshipped together (once including All Saints Episcopal Church), served in some mission projects together, picnicked together, shared some WELCA activities, and even enjoyed a couple evenings at the theater (Music Guild) together.

I firmly believe that the more we do things together, the stronger our bond and the better prepared we are to embrace whatever change may be headed our way.

These, of course, are just a couple examples of the changes that are headed our way. There will be others. Some we may already be anticipating while others are unknown to us right now.

And while change may be inevitable, there are a couple things that remain constant.

The first constant is the love and presence of God. No matter what changes that will, without doubt, come, God, through the Holy Spirit, will be walking with us to support us, lead us, and, from time to time, push us. And while some of the changes we may experience might not have the results we hope for, we also trust that God's church will continue in some form and God's word will be proclaimed.

The second constant is the work we do for the mission of Christ in the world. I am confident that as we experience the changes that certainly lie ahead, we will continue to serve Christ by serving our neighbors by:

- Serving the hungry through things like providing meals at the Christian Care and Café on Vine, and providing non-perishables to local food pantries.
- Bringing comfort and warmth to those in need with our quilts, Afghans, hats, scarves, mittens, etc.
- Sharing the love of God around the world from financial support to a hospital in Tanzania to water filters for the people of Romania and Guatemala.
- Supporting the work of the church in Illinois, the United States and the around the globe through our mission support to the Northern Illinois Synod.
- Supporting our community by providing space for community organizations to meet.
- Lifting up the members of our congregations through prayer, financial support, hands-on help, funeral meals, smiles and hugs.
- Providing opportunities for people to grow in faith through worship and Bible study.
- And many other ways.

Change is inevitable. The church, including our congregations, will not look the same in five or ten years as it does now. But no matter how it changes, it will still be built on the foundation of God's love, and it will continue.

I am proud of the ways our congregations are preparing for change and thankful for the support of each you as we seek to be the presence of God through whatever change may be coming.

Women's Circle



Companion Parishes in Tanzania

Rev. Enock Loriki is the pastor of our companion Mdori Parish in the North Central Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania. Pastor Loriki sent a letter expressing **"courage through your strong prayers and gift funds. In the year 2025 with great joy, we received \$1600 from you for the Studies of Evangelist and others. We really thank you."**

One female student who completed her studies at Mwika Bible and Theological College was ordained on February 2, 2025. Rev. Ruth Teveli is the pastor in charge of Loorkisale Parish, while the first male is in Simanjiro Parish as leading pastor.

Two Evangelists and six students of Christian Education graduated on December 6, 2025. Four students of Christian Education and others will graduate next year after meeting the College Qualification.

On November 20, 2025 Mdori Parish divided into two parishes, Mdori Parish which remains with 10 congregations and the new Parish of Tarangire remain with 3 congregations. Pastor Loriki says "For now I am still the minister of both parishes while I am in my studies. Please continue to pray for me."

On the same day their first Evangelist Solomon Leyan retired at the age of 65 at Kakoy Congregation after serving God in Mdori Parish for 27 years. The Parish rewarded him a house of 3 rooms which is now at finishing level.
