From the Pastor:

I've used the following story as a children's sermon from time to time over the course of my career. It is called "A View from the Bottom of a Garbage Can," from the book "Fantasies for Fantastic Christians" by Hubert F. Beck.

There I was at the bottom of this gigantic garbage can! It was terrifying! Either I had been miniaturized (as you can well imagine) or the garbage can was enormously magnified, for I was way underneath trash of all sorts!

"Hey, you down there!" the voice was like thunder... It boomed out again, still louder, "Hey you down there! Look up here."

I looked up and could barely make out daylight through all the junk. "Who's there?" I asked rather shakily.

"Never mind who's here. Just start climbing out!"


Then it came again! "Learned anything yet?"


Committee Meetings

ST. JAMES COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS, OCTOBER 2021

The in-person and virtual October 2021 Council meeting was called to order at 7:04 p.m. on Wednesday, October 20th, by President Chip Johnson. Nine out of ten members were present. Pastor Knowles opened with a prayer. The minutes of the September meeting were approved. The Treasurer's report through September featured a prorated operating surplus of \$486. We are in very good financial shape; receipts and expenses are in line with the time of year. Pastor Knowles commented that his continuing education event in Gettysburg, PA, was quite worthwhile. On Saturday, October 23rd he will participate in the ordination service for Catie Ford (Catie Nelson when she supplied for Pastor Knowles at St. James). Her first assignment is at Faith Lutheran Church in Three Lakes, Wl. Materials for the new flooring for the Choir Room have arrived locally, so progress will soon be made. The framework for the lower door's portico is now up. We approved the bimonthly mailing of weekly offering envelopes to members by American These will replace the packets of envelopes given to members at the beginning of each year. The meeting was adjourned at 7:32 p.m. The next meeting will be held on Wednesday, November 17th, at 7:00 p.m.

\$3,065 to local Food Pantries.


\$16,550 to our St. James Scholarship at the Lutheran School of Theology.
