Perhaps, in the simplest of terms, that song, which we all learned as children, is the essence of our call as Christians. Our mission, as individuals and as a congregation, is to shine the light of Christ for all the world to see. Our mission is to shine the light of Christ so that all may come to the light. My perspective in this regard has been recently and strongly influenced by a book, *Manna & Mercy*, by Daniel Erlander (who was confirmed at Calvary in 1953). Erlander contends that it is God's intention, not to destroy a broken creation, but to mend it. God, he says, intends to return the world to "shalom," the harmony of the Garden of Eden.

The job of God's people, then, according to Erlander, is to be the beacon of the light of God that draws all nations to it to restore God's shalom. He describes the people's mission as exhibiting such a life of shalom (a oneness with God, each other, and all of creation) that everyone will want to come and be a part of it.

I think that is a perfect way to describe the mission of the people of God. We are called on to be such a community of light, a shalom community, that everyone will see us and want to be a part of us.

Although we, obviously, have not yet achieved that shalom community, I think St. James shines the light of Christ in so many marvelous ways. Because of your faith and generosity we have been able to shine the light of Christ by:

Our weekly in-person worship coupled with live-streaming our services on Facebook, enabling many members and friends (old and new) to join us in worship when they have not been able to physically be with us.

Providing for those in need in our community and throughout the world. The shopping cart keeps being filled with non-perishables for a local food pantry, we regularly provide a meal for people in need through Christian Care, and we have made significant donations to the World Hunger Appeal.

Our support of the ministry of the Mdori Parish in Tanzania.

Sharing school kits and quilts created by our sewing group to bring warmth and the love of God to people around the world.

Hats and mittens from the mitten tree were given to provide warmth for local children.

Your graciousness to me with a surprise celebration of my 35th Anniversary of Ordination. I was literally brought to tears by your kindness.

The generosity of our regular giving which has enabled us to continue to support ministries throughout the world.

The endowed scholarship in the name of St. James at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago which has helped a seminarian prepare to be a future leader in the church.

And the list of our shining lights goes on.

Our work, however, is not done and will not be done until God's shalom comes to fruition. We need to continue the work of shining the light of Christ in ways we have been doing and by being open to new ways of letting "this little light of mine" to shine in an ever-changing world.

It is my hope and prayer that we may continue to be open to God's mission for us, that we may indeed be a beacon of light that draws people to Christ through the darkness that so often pervades our world.

ST. JAMES COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS, JANUARY 2023

The in-person and virtual January 2023 Council meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. on Wednesday, January 18th, by President Bethany Weipert. Eight of the ten members were present. Pastor Knowles opened with a prayer. The minutes of the December meeting were approved.

The Treasurer's year-end report, which also served as December's monthly report, reflected an outstanding year. The highlight was the extraordinary gift from the Davis Trusts. None of that money was used in our operating budget, nor were the previous years' surpluses. In fact, we ended the year with a \$1,666 surplus.

Pastor Knowles informed us that Dr. Hildreth's sister had passed away unexpectedly. Pastor's wife Mary will be our substitute organist on Sunday, January 22 nd.

An application was made to the Endowment Team for funds to respond to the Mdori Parish's request for help in sending three evangelists to theological school.

In April, cost estimates will be obtained for finishing the underside of the portico.

We voted to continue our contract with 3D Lawn and Landscape for mowing, trimming, edging, and blowing.

We voted to change the office copy machine contract from R.K. Dixon (Xerox) to Access Systems (Sharp). We will get a new copier in the process!

We voted to present the final version of the Proposed 2023 Budget to the congregation for its approval at the Annual Meeting on January 29th .

Ruth Anne Hartman presented a list of possible recipients of the tithe of Natalie Davis's Trust. These are a mixture of local and non-local ministries. The list will be discussed at the Annual Meeting, at which attendees can propose additions, deletions, or changes to it. As it stands now, after the Annual meeting the Council will finalize the list and determine allocations for each recipient.

Due to the instructor and some potential students being out of town, plans for training sessions on the use of the defibrillator (AED) and basic first aid have been tabled until at least March.

We expressed appreciation for the fine service of the outgoing Council members, which are Ruth Anne Hartman, Jo Kempf, and Frank Palicki.

The next meeting will be on Wednesday, February 15, 2023, at 7:00 p.m.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.


available at church on the 5th. Meet in the church kitchen on the 8th at 5:30 pm or bring prepared items before that
